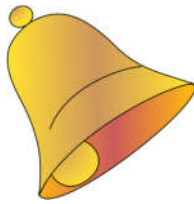

Note from Pastor Brian...

Dear Church Family,

We are loving being here in Warsaw and so much appreciate your making us feel so welcome and helping us adjust. Two things I believe God impressed upon my heart coming to First UMC Warsaw this summer were the importance of identity (both personal and corporate) and seeking God through prayer. I believe these two things are foundational to our faith. The Scripture I believe highlights this best is II Chronicles 7:14. After the completion of the Temple in Jerusalem, God speaks to King Solomon these words, "If my people, who are called by my name (**identity**), shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways (**seeking God through prayer**); then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."

We are wrapping up a series of sermons regarding our identity in Christ both personally and corporately as a church with Homecoming Sunday on September 9, 10:00am with a combined worship service with communion at the Connection Campus. I am so excited about what God is doing in and through the church and looking forward to the whole church coming together to worship and celebrate our mission as one, showcasing the many ways we are helping people connect to God through the various ministries of the church. Beginning September 16, we will make the shift from identity to the importance of seeking after God through prayer.

Many of us have made prayer for people and situations around us an ongoing part of our faith journey and this is a very good thing. I believe God honors those prayers as we seek for God's intervention in people's lives. But how often are we in the habit of simply seeking God in prayer to deepen our relationship with Him - seeking to know God more intimately.... seeking to be filled with the fullness of God. The Apostle Paul prays for the Church in Ephesians 3, "[that you may come] to know [practically, through personal experience] the love of Christ which far surpasses [mere] knowledge [without experience], that you may be filled up [throughout your being] to all the fullness of God

[so that you may have the richest experience of **God's presence in your lives**, completely filled and flooded with God Himself]" (Amplified Version).

It has been my experience that when my prayers begin with seeking after God in this manner, my walk with God is much closer, I have a better awareness of my identity in Christ, and I am more in a position for God to work in me and through me. When those prayers are joined in a group with other believers I believe the power of God's presence is further amplified. At times there is such a strong sense of the presence of God that it evokes an emotional response, conviction of sin, and a passion for God's Kingdom. At other times nothing. The important thing is taking the time to be in the presence of God seeking Him in prayer both alone and with others.

My experience has been that the more I seek God, the more I encounter the presence of God. The more I encounter the presence of God, the deeper my relationship with God grows. The deeper my relationship with God grows, the uglier sin in my own life becomes. The more I am filled with God's Spirit and emptied of myself and sin, the more I am able to reflect God's image. The more I am able to reflect God's image, the more God's love and presence in me (Christ in me) blesses others.

I have witnessed when a church makes the prayer of seeking after God the priority and is filled with the fullness of God, the impact not only on the church, but also the community is profound. So, I invite you to make this a priority in your personal prayer time, in your family prayer time, and in corporate prayer times in church and small groups. A simple place to start is Paul's prayer in Philippians 3:10, "I want to know you Christ and the power of your resurrection."

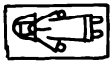
